



#### :: Success of the Community Approach

- Designated as most comprehensive municipal/utilities GIS in Canada by ESRI (2003)
- City review comparing the Sault to 10 other similar sized municipalities showed the Sault was lowest cost by 50% with at least 10 times as much to show for it. (2005)
- Stated by the Urban Institute of Canada as the first real "Information Utility" (2006)
- NGenera lists the Sault Community Geomatics Centre as the best example of leveraging public data for public good (2008)
- ESRI Canada (2008) states that SSMIC is leading the world in health geomatics
- ESRI Canada (2008) designates SSMIC as the first to create a holistic approach to community GIS
- ESRI Inc. declares Sault Ste. Marie as most comprehensive community GIS in the world (2008)

- Province of Ontario introduces renewable energy incentives
- POD sends out information requests to many Ontario Municipalities
- EDC sends Information request to CGC.
- CGC responds in 2 hours with 6 sites meeting all criteria
- POD comes to the Sault
- POD gets approval on 4 Renewable Energy Standard Offer Contracts with the Ontario Power Authority (OPA)




